# **Preparing for Your Journey**

Make sure all required documentation listed on the International Student Information Sheet has been submitted. You may access this information sheet via the McLennan website: www.mclennan.edu.

Make sure you have been accepted. You should have submitted a completed international admissions application packet. Please note: Admissions application packets are not reviewed until all required documents have been received.

Make sure you have received an acceptance packet that includes your I-20, acceptance letter, and information about paying the \$200 SEVIS fee upon your acceptance to McLennan. Once the paperwork is prepared, you will be contacted about how you would like the information sent to you. You may pick it up from Highlander Central, have it sent through regular mail, or pay to have it sent to you through Express Mail through https://study.eshipglobal.com.

Complete the SEVIS I-901 Form and pay the fee.\* See www.fmjfee.com/i901fee for more information.

\*Please note this cannot be done until you have received your I-20.

Make travel arrangements prior to arriving to the United States or prior to arriving on campus and plan for short-term accommodations, as necessary.

Prepare for exchange of money or traveler's checks: U.S. currency, transferring funds to the United States, opening a bank account, banking glossary, credit cards, etc. Please view these helpful links:

# Working as an F-1 Student

## On Campus

There is no waiting period for employment; students are eligible upon obtaining and enrolling with an F-1 status. Initial-entry students cannot begin work more than 30 days before classes start.

Although international students may work any position on campus, there is a 20-hour-per-week limit during long semesters (fall and spring). Students may work as many hours as they wish during breaks (i.e. summer, winter break, and Spring Break).

International students are allowed to work only in Non-Work Study positions on campus. Non-Work Study positions vary based on budgeting for each department. Students will need to speak with various departments to inquire about employment possibilities.

On-campus employment does not require the International Student Advisor's approval.



## **Off Campus**

International students holding an F-1 visa are not allowed to work off campus without prior approval from the International Student Advisor and USCIS.

Very few situations will allow for off-campus employment. The most common is severe, unforeseen economic hardship.

The student must have been in F-1 status for at least one full academic year and must prove to USCIS that employment is necessary due to severe economic hardship caused by circumstances beyond his or her control that arose after obtaining F-1 status.

An appointment must be made with the International Student Advisor to go over the required documentation, forms, and fees that are necessary to apply for off-campus employment.

## **Curricular Practical Training**

What is CPT? NAFSA regulations state that curricular practical training (CPT) must be "an integral part of an established curriculum." They define curricular practical training as "alternate work/study, internship, cooperative education, or any other type of required internship or practicum which is offered by sponsoring employers through cooperative agreements with the school." (NAFSA Adviser's Manual)

In general CPT is not offered at McLennan because none of the college's programs require a work/study, internship, or cooperative education program.

## **Optional Practical Training**

What is OPT? Optional practical training (OPT) is defined in NAFSA regulations as "temporary employment for practical training directly related to the student's major area of study."

The student must have been lawfully enrolled on a fulltime basis at a Department of Homeland Security-approved school for one full academic year before being eligible for OPT. OPT is available both before and after completion of the educational objective, but different rules apply to pre- and post-completion OPT.

Students may engage in OPT for any employer for the duration of OPT authorization as long as the employment qualifies under OPT standards.

Standard OPT is available for a cumulative maximum of 12 months per educational level.

OPT must be directly related to the student's course of study.

No offer of employment is required to apply for standard OPT, but the student is expected to work during the OPT EAD validity period. Students on post-completion OPT are limited to a maximum of 90 days of unemployment.

An appointment must be made with the International Student Advisor to go over the required documentation, forms, and fees that are necessary to apply.

## **Social Security Numbers**

For more information, visit www.socialsecurity.gov. If a position is found for employment on campus, off campus, or OPT, you MUST contact the International Student Advisor to learn what documentation is needed in order to accept the position and apply for your Social Security card.

In general, only noncitizens who have permission to work from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) can apply for a Social Security number. We suggest you wait until you are in the United States for at least 10 days before you apply for a Social Security number. Also, you should report to your school prior to applying for a number. Taking these actions will ensure that we can verify your immigration status with DHS.

To apply for a Social Security number, complete an application for a Social Security card (Form SS-5) and show us original documents proving your:

- Immigration status
- Work eligibility
- Age
- Identity

# **Texas Driver License Requirements for International Students**

Students wishing to obtain a Texas driver license must take the following documents to the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) Office located at 1617 E. Crest Drive in Waco or call 254-759-7121 for more information:

- Passport
- Visa
- I-94 Card
- Current I-20
- Validated class schedule from McLennan's Records & Registration Office
- Letter of current enrollment from International Advisor
- Social Security card if you have one; if not, you must complete a Social Security number affidavit available at the Texas DPS Office

If the student already has a current driver license issued in another state, they must take that license with them and their social security card, if they have one. The out-of-state license must be surrendered when applying for the Texas driver license.

If the out-of-state license is expired, the student MUST re-test in order to be issued a Texas driver license.

International Students with Texas driver license are required to renew them annually. Students will receive notice from the TxDPS notifying them when they are due for a renewal.
