If you're a bright high school student eager to get a head start on your college career, McLennan Community College's Early Admissions Program could be just what you need.

MCC's Early Admissions Program allows qualifying students to take up to two college credit courses per semester the summer before or during their senior year of high school. The college credit hours you earn become official when you graduate from high school and submit an official high school transcript.

Advantages

MCC's friendly campus, with instructors who genuinely care about your academic success, is the perfect place to ease into the college experience. MCC is an accredited institution, so your college credits are transferable to four-year colleges and universities. Paying low tuition and fees while living at home allows you to earn those first college credit hours at a substantial savings.

Qualifications

High school students who have completed their junior year with a "B" average or better and who need no more than four high school credits to graduate may be eligible for the Early Admissions Program.

In addition, students must pass all sections of the state-mandated high school test and the appropriate portions of the Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) or an approved alternative (Accuplacer). Students also need approval from their high school principal or counselor and parent/guardian to enroll in the program. Previous concurrent enrollment courses taken at MCC will be taken into account as well.

How to Apply

It's easy to apply for MCC's Early Admissions Program:

1. Complete the Early Admission Application at right and have it signed by your high school principal or counselor and parent/guardian.
2. Complete required testing (Accuplacer, THEA, or appropriate alternative). Students who present exemplary scores on SAT, ACT or the state-mandated high school test may be exempt.
3. Complete an application for admission to the college and submit it to the Student Admissions Office.
4. Make an appointment to meet with a Career Development Specialist at MCC for academic advising. (Bring a copy of your high school transcript.)
