McLennan Community College's Alternative Teacher Certification program is accredited by the State Board for Educator Certification SBEC/Texas Education Agency (TEA).

Upon successful completion of MCC's program and state mandated certification exams, individuals will be certified to teach in Texas schools. The program trains individuals with a bachelor's degree who desire to enter the teaching profession.

Admission Requirements

Applicants seeking Texas alternative teacher certification at MCC should meet the following criteria:

- 1) hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher learning;
- 2) have 24 college hours in teaching field with 12 of those hours at the junior/senior level for high school core courses;
- 3) 2.5 GPA on last 30 hours of college work or accumulative GPA; and
- 4) take placement exam within the last 5 years, such as Accuplacer or THEA Exam, ACT, and SAT. *Passing scores on THEA are 230 in Reading, 270 in Math, and 220 in Writing. Passing scores on Accuplacer are 78 in Reading, 96 in Math and 80+ and 5 in Writing.*

According to Texas Administrative Code, Title 19, Subchapter A, Rule 230.5, anyone seeking admittance to an approved teacher preparation program must be assessed for college level skills in reading, oral and written communication and mathematics.

The applicant who meets these criteria will need to complete the following:

- 1) application
- 2) official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- 3) application fee (\$40)
- 4) three (3) professional references
- 5) interview (Students entering the bilingual certification will need to interview both in English and Spanish. The student must also pass the TOPT test to be certified.)

Important: Effective August 1, 2007, once an individual is accepted into the MCC Alternative Teacher Certification program, he/she has five years from the date of acceptance to complete the program. If the individual has not completed the certification program within the five years, he/she will need to reapply into the program. In addition, the Program Director can drop students from the program in less than the five-year period if the student is not demonstrating progress in his/her certification.

Alternative Teacher Certification at MCC

Acceptance

Applicants who complete the above steps and meet the academic qualifications for the certification specialization they have chosen will be invited to schedule an interview.

Once the interview has been completed, all references checked, all transcripts received and reviewed, a decision concerning the student's acceptance into the program will be made.

When admitted to the program, *the student will complete the following courses:*

- 1) ***Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities*** (secondary, middle, or elementary) - Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities (88 class hours). This course covers the theory and practice of Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities. Preparation for the following Texas State Exams: TExES 100 (elementary), TExES 130 (middle school), TExES 130 (secondary) and the TExES 160 (EC - 12) will be the major emphasis. These courses cover the theory and practices essential to good teaching methods, as practiced by Texas' best teachers. In addition, the practical classroom aspects are observed, studied and debated.
- 2) ***Content area teaching methods*** - (each certification area will require a different content area specialization class; not all content area specializations will be needed).
MCC currently offers certification in **Art EC-12, Business Education, Bilingual Generalist EC-4 & 4-8, ESL Generalist EC-4 & 4-8, English Language Arts and Reading (Secondary), Family and Consumer Studies, Generalist EC-4, Generalist 4 - 8, Health Education EC-12; Health Science Technology Education (HSTE) 8-12, History (8-12), Journalism (Secondary), Life Science (Secondary), Math (Secondary), Music EC-12; PE EC-12; Science (4-8), Science (8-12), Social Studies 4 - 8, Social Studies (8-12), Spanish (Secondary), Special Education EC-12, Speech Communications (Secondary), Technology Education (6-12), and Theater Arts EC-12.**
- 3) ***Internship*** - once a student has secured a position as a teacher in a school system, the student must enroll in the next Internship class. The student becomes the teacher of record for the class, drawing district pay as a teacher (amount may depend on certification in some districts).

The student must make a B or better in each class of the Alternative Teacher Certification Program. If not, the student must retake the course.

Teacher Internship (EC - 12)

When the student has found a position as a teacher, MCC will continue to provide assistance and guidance throughout the first year of teaching in a Texas school. Internship begins as soon as the student accepts a teaching position, any time during the course of either the Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities or the teaching methods classes or after completing the classes. Over the course of a full school year, the student intern will work with the campus principal, an assigned school mentor, and the supervising mentor. Students will attend the Internship classes at MCC, Internship I (TCIN 1004) or Internship II (TCIN 1005). The internship class experience is designed to help the student intern by providing assistance and guidance while they are actually teaching. (*ATC students must inform MCC as soon as a teaching position is accepted*).

All Alternative Teacher Certification students must take the internship as soon as possible after they accept a teaching position. *The Internship should preferably be taken in consecutive semesters.*

McLennan Community's College's Alternative Certification Program is a highly supervised experience for our interns. Our supervising mentors evaluate our interns twice each semester, have post-conferences with interns and do both formal and informal consulting on a regular and as needed basis. MCC pays a stipend for school mentors to assist our interns on a daily basis. The mentor does monthly evaluations and conferences with the intern as well as monthly checklist to monitor intern's progress. Interns are required to observe their school mentor once a month also. Both of these monthly visits are documented and the documentation is turned in to the internship instructor each month. Supervising mentors are also required to conference with administrators and school mentors as they complete a year end recommendation form for certification form that our program requires. Supervising mentors also, as needed, complete a professional growth plan that outlines areas in need of improvement with a timeline for implementation. This is only done for interns who are need of assistance. Interns meet internship class once a month for three hours and have a clinically supervised internship during the school year.

Students teach/work 183 days x 7 hours = 1,281 hours a year or 640.5 each semester; plus, the internship classes meet 15 contact hours a semester (total of 30 semester hours).

Beginning Fall 2008, students in the ATC program who request Probationary Certification will need to be registered in an internship-type course during the school year even though they may have already taken a year of internship to fulfill SBEC's requirement. This requirement states that districts hiring teachers who hold a probationary certificate because they are participating in an approved Alternative Certification Program must still review and verify the highly qualified status for those teachers.

Certification

Once an applicant is accepted into MCC's Alternative Teacher Certification Program and has a teaching position, the student **must apply** for Probationary Certification **whether or not** the public/private school district requires such certification. Students must apply for certification with the **State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC)**. After successfully completing the Internship class, passing all necessary examinations, and meeting all MCC requirements, the student will want to apply for full standard certification.

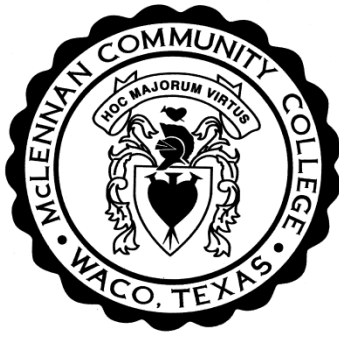

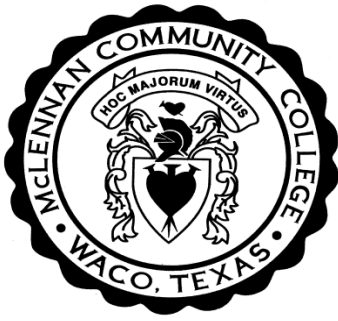
