Community Composter Certification

This six-week course includes 1-2 field trips, 25 hours of volunteer work, and an independent project. Participants will learn to promote composting within the community.

CITY OF WACO WINTER WEATHER TIPS

Winter weather is already upon us, Waco! Here are some tips to help you take care of your house and pets:

- Cover all outdoor faucets.
- If you find a leak at home, turn off the water using the valve next to your meter. (Make sure you know where your water valve is!)
- Insulate indoor and outdoor pipes.
- Open cabinet doors, allowing heat to get to uninsulated pipes under sinks.
- Let water drip overnight, especially on outside walls.
- Bring your pets inside exposure to extreme temperatures can lead to hypothermia, frostbite, and even death.
- Cover plants with plastic, or bring them inside a warm space or a green house.





Our landfill is one of the area's single largest emitters of greenhouse gas pollution. This happens because organic matter (like food waste) creates methane, which is more potent than carbon dioxide for its impact on global climate change. The best solution we have to deal with this problem is keeping food waste out of the landfill. HOUSE BILL: PFAS CHEMICALS

89(R) HB 1674: Many fertilizers contain "forever chemicals" (PFAS). There is evidence PFAS chemicals are linked to environmental and health problems. This bill seeks to severely limit how many PFAS chemicals can be used in commercial agricultural fertilizers.

89(R) HB 1730: This bill seeks to provide money to study the effects of PFAS chemicals on public health.
