#### KEEP WACO BEAUTIFUL CIGARETTE LITTER PREVENTION PROGRAM



Thanks to a grant with Keep America Beautiful®, Wacoans can keep our city beautiful by tossing their cigarettes in convenient bins. 25 bins are located across the city at Lake Waco, Brazos River, and downtown Waco.

It's time to put cigarettes in their place! Be a good neighbor and toss your litter in a designated area. All cigarettes collected are recycled with TerraCycle. The bins are maintained by <u>Mission Waco Street Sweep</u>, helping to employ those who are facing homelessness with a livable wage.

Since launching in 2022, 41 pounds of cigarette litter has been pulled from our city streets, parks, waterways and downtown area.

## A SAFER HOME STARTS WITH A WACO FIRE ASSESSMENT

The Waco Fire Department is always ready to respond on your worst day, but we're also here to help you prevent emergencies from happening. Sign up for a free home safety assessment with a licensed fire inspector. We'll help identify potential risks and give you a detailed report with recommendations to make your home as safe as possible.

The assessment identifies likely hazards and risks to avoid unfortunate events. A licensed fire inspector will review:

smoke alarms carbon monoxide alarms electrical hazards fire extinguishers fall hazards escape plans appliance safety

chemical and hazardous materials

child safety concerns healthy environment

A recommendation report will be provided. All corrective measures are the responsibility of the homeowner. Corrective actions are not required nor enforced on privately owned homes.
