Instructions for Completing the Application

1. **Read carefully and think about your answers.** Remember that the Admissions Committee reviews many applications each year. Handwritten applications are not accepted and incomplete application packets cannot be reviewed. Your portfolio is complete when it contains all of the components listed below.
2. **Do not attach résumés or other materials.** Remember that the number of activities listed is generally less significant than the quality and commitment. Consider listing activities that show leadership, creativity, and a sense of responsibility in the community.
3. **Answer the essay questions carefully and thoughtfully.** These questions allow the Admissions Committee to gauge both your critical thinking and writing skills. The committee is interested only in your best work—and only your work.

- Enclosed your high school transcript and (if applicable) college transcripts.
- Signed your application.
