NOTICES**I understand that:**

- Students will accept terms and conditions, detailed on the opposite side of this form, each semester.
- Students may access their class schedule each semester in MyMCC for parent review.
- College courses are more challenging than high school courses and may address controversial material.
- College courses taken while in high school will be recorded on a college transcript and may impact the student's future college career and/or financial aid.
- High school students enrolled in college courses will be treated as college students and will adhere to the guidelines and policies of the College.
- Most MCC dual credit advising guides are recommended for students seeking an AA, AS, or bachelor's degree from a TX public institution. Students with other plans should request individual college advising.
- All MCC students are welcome to visit with an MCC academic advisor.
- Students who do not qualify for free tuition will be billed for courses each semester, and payment should be made by the published deadline (typically 10 days before the start of the semester).
- The college may not discuss student records with parents without a legal release from the student.
- Students must be TSIA compliant and select a program of study to enroll beyond 15 semester credit hours.
- Students requesting online courses may be enrolled in courses with traditional college students if dual credit-only sections are not available.

FINANCIAL AID FOR SWIFT TRANSFER (FAST)

MCC participates in the Texas state financial aid program for dual credit students, FAST. Eligible public and charter school students will not be charged for **dual credit** tuition, fees, or required textbooks/course materials.

No application is needed for this aid program. Eligibility is determined by the state and is based on the student being reported to TEA as educationally disadvantaged in any of the four academic years prior to the dual credit enrollment.

- ALL DC students enter as conditional admission with a limit of 15 semester credit hours (SCH).
- To continue beyond 15 SCH, students must be TSIA compliant and select an MCC program of study.

Terms and Conditions

Registration for courses at McLennan Community College creates a financial obligation to the College for tuition, fees and other charges incurred by you. Tuition, fees and any other charges are added to your student account and are considered a loan for educational purposes. Acknowledging the following terms and conditions will complete your registration. New regulations require your acknowledgement and failure to acknowledge and submit your agreement could result in your courses being dropped.

I acknowledge my financial obligation to McLennan Community College for the course/courses for which I have enrolled and if I decide not to attend classes, I understand it is my responsibility to drop my classes according to the Highlander Guide.

NOTE: Dropping courses or withdrawing from MCC does not relieve a student of their financial obligation to the College for any unpaid charges (including financial aid adjustments) incurred for the related semester or term. MCC will submit for collection any delinquent balance and an additional fee will be added to the balance for collection charges.

According to the Highlander Guide, my failure to make payment of tuition, fees or any other incidental charges by the due date will prohibit me from:

- registering for classes in the current term
- receiving credit for work completed during a semester
- receiving a transcript that I have requested
- enrolling in future terms

Although MCC accepts payment via student financial aid and third party sponsorship, I understand the responsibility for payment remains with me. If financial aid is not granted, withdrawn or if third party sponsors do not pay as invoiced, I will be required to make payment. If I am receiving financial aid or a third party sponsorship and I drop after the semester begins, I understand I will be responsible for any balance if financial aid or the third party sponsorship is withdrawn.
