Awarded upon successful completion of all courses.

Medical Laboratory Assistant Certification Process

After completion of all courses, six months of full-time acceptable clinical experience, and high school graduation, students may sit for the national certification exam as a Medical Laboratory Assistant.

Phlebotomy Occupational Skills Award

Awarded upon successful completion of all courses except HPRS 1209.

Phlebotomy Certification Exam

Upon successful completion of PLAB 1323 and PLAB 1260, and high school graduation, students may sit for the national certification exam as a phlebotomy technician.

Students Must:

- Turn 18 years of age by May 31, spring semester of senior year, to enroll in the program.
- Submit a current record of required vaccinations prior to enrollment in PLAB 1260.
- Undergo drug screening and background check prior to enrollment in PLAB 1260.
